Telva McGruder

Telva McGruder is a lifetime member of Girl Scouts and is currently serving as the chair of the board of the Girl Scouts of Southeastern Michigan (GSSEM). Growing up in southwestern Ohio, Telva was an eager Girl Scout from Brownie through Cadette. Girl Scouting exposed her to challenges and adventures that first encouraged her thirst to reach past her limits. She was a troop leader for 10 years where she enjoyed supporting the girls' growth into impactful Ambassadors with two of them earning their Gold Award. As a GSSEM director, she supported development of the council 2017-2019 GSSEM strategic plan in alignment with GSUSA.

Telva is currently the chief diversity, equity and inclusion officer at General Motors where she leads the development and execution of strategies that will ensure positive change toward a high performing, inclusive culture. In this role, Telva leads workforce strategy for the company, where the focus is building the agile workforce of the future, creating pathways of entry and career development. She is also a member of the General Motors Inclusion Advisory Board. Prior to her current role, Telva was director of Workplace Engineering and Operations Solutions where she supported the global footprint for facility engineering, technologies, energy strategy and multiple facility management strategies. Her team created compelling workplaces, ensured a safe work environment, and focused on operational carbon footprint reduction through energy efficiencies and renewable energy procurement.

Earlier in her career, Telva held positions of increasing responsibility and influence within manufacturing engineering and at several manufacturing locations where she motivated teams to rethink the possible in project execution, maintenance, quality, operations and labor negotiations. She earned her BS and MS degrees in Electrical Engineering from Purdue University.

Telva is committed to service and to helping others become all they are meant to be. She supports numerous professional and community organizations through mentoring, teaching, speaking and other forms of direct engagement. Telva is vice-chair of the board of advocacy and resource development for the Oakland University School of Health Sciences, a member of the advisory board for the University of Michigan School for Environment and Sustainability, a member of the board of Engineering Tomorrow and a member of the Executive Leadership Council. Telva is a positive, passionate leader with a keen sense of what is important and enjoys wonderful life experiences with her husband, son and two daughters.

Trimeka Benjamin is the President & CEO of Swim Digital Group, a higher education consulting firm operating on the principle of changing generational poverty by increasing access to education. Trimeka founded Swim because of her steadfast belief that the world is full of students whose lives are just waiting to be changed through removing barriers to accessing post-secondary education. This work has come to life through her partnerships with Colleges & Universities nationwide, addressing transformational change in student enrollment and retention and experiences both in and out of the classroom. Trimeka's personal and professional educational experiences demonstrate her commitment to supporting community colleges and Historically Black Colleges and Universities; she is driven to provide educational opportunities to underserved students and to help build economic and social mobility for underrepresented populations. Trimeka has served as the Chair of the Board of The Spring of Tampa Bay, worked with Girl Scouts of West Central Florida, and co-founded the Women's Exchange. She is a Sustainer of the Junior League, a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority Incorporated, Women in Leadership and Philanthropy, and International Women's Forum.

Kathalin Carvalho is the global director of regulatory compliance at Sitel Group. She has more than 15 years of experience working in the areas of financial crimes, risk management, corporate legal compliance and criminal investigations for domestic and international institutions. She is the founding Co-Chair of the Central Florida Chapter for the Association of Certified Anti-Money Laundering Specialists, dedicated to providing resources for financial institutions and related industries in the areas of career development, educational growth and professional networking since 2012. She has served as the president of the Sheriff's Hispanic Advisory Council for two consecutive years and received the 2018 Leadership Class Award from the Tampa Hispanic Heritage. 

Mallory Dimmitt



Mallory Dimmitt is the inaugural CEO of the Florida Wildlife Corridor Foundation and former vice president of strategic development for Lykes Bros., a fifth-generation, family-owned, agribusiness based in Florida. Previously, she led The Nature Conservancy's Colorado Plateau Initiative from Telluride, Colorado, assessing large-scale conservation opportunities in a four-state region of the West, and prior to that directed the Southwest Colorado Project for the Conservancy's Colorado Chapter. She has served as a member of Telluride's Town Council and has worked with local, regional, state and federal agencies and organizations on natural resource issues.

Rhea Law became the University of South Florida's eighth president in March 2022. Over the course of her 35-year-plus career, she has held top leadership positions with several Florida-based organizations. She is the first USF graduate to serve as president. As one of the founding members of the USF Board of Trustees, she spent five years as vice chair and four years as the first (and only) female chair. Previously, Law was chief executive officer and chair of the board of Fowler White Boggs, a Florida-based law firm. Currently, Law serves on the Board of Directors of Tampa Electric Company and Peoples Gas. She also serves on the Executive Committee of the Tampa Bay Economic Development Council, the Tampa Bay Chamber, the Council of Governors for the Tampa Bay Partnership and on the H. Lee Moffitt Cancer Center Board of Directors and National Board of Advisors.

Dr. Sylvia D. Campbell, MD, FACS serves as the President of the Board of Directors of Village Partners International. She was born in Orlando, Florida, and received a BS and MS from Emory University in Atlanta, Ga. Later she received her MD from the University of South Florida, and completed a General Surgery residency there. She currently is in private practice in Tampa. She has served on and currently is President of the Board of the Judeo-Christian Health Clinic, a free medical clinic in Tampa, has served on the Board of the Medical Benevolence Foundation of the Presbyterian Church, as an elder with the Presbyterian Church, and was involved in development of Trauma Care Systems and Injury Prevention in the state as well as nationally. She has served on the Executive Committee of the Board of Governors of the American College of Surgeons, and currently serves on the Advisory Council of Operation Giving Back of the American College of Surgeons. She has served on mission trips to Haiti and Uganda since 1996, and been involved in helping children travel to the US for life saving care. She is married to Bob Campbell and has three children, Chelsey, Meaghan and Ross.

Veronica Cintron joined the Hillsborough County Aviation Authority in April 2020. As Vice President of Communications, she oversees all internal and external messaging for America's Favorite Airport. Before joining Tampa International Airport's award-winning Communications team, she anchored Spectrum Bay News 9's weekday evening newscasts for 10 years. During her journalism career, Veronica covered major domestic and international stories including Pope Francis' first-ever visit to Cuba, the 100th anniversary of the Panama Canal, and the aftermath of Hurricane Maria in Puerto Rico. Her work earned six Suncoast Chapter Emmy awards, Florida Association of Broadcast Journalists awards and Society of Professional Journalists Sunshine State awards.

Veronica serves on The Florida Aquarium Board and is a member of the University of South Florida's Advancing Latino Access and Success Task Force, the University of South Florida Zimmerman School of Advertising and Communications Advisory Council, and the Athena Society. A History of Women of Distinction

In 1992, Girl Scouts USA celebrated their 80th anniversary and introduced a National Women of Distinction honor to the celebration. Councils throughout the country began recognizing women who had made extraordinary accomplishments in their communities. Locally, the first Suncoast Council Women of Distinction event nominated women from our membership. The event focused on career opportunities, as the Women of Distinction held panel discussions for Girl Scout members.

Former Hillsborough County Commissioner Jan Platt was instrumental in moving the Women of Distinction recognition to the next level in 1994. That year, a committee was introduced to solicit nominations, a special reception to honor the women was held, and the women received a recognition pin created by a local artist. The focus also shifted toward a mentoring program for Girl Scouts working to achieve their Gold Award.

Over the next few years, the event solidified its importance within the community. Sponsors came forward to help recognize these outstanding women while supporting the Girl Scouts. In 1995, Gayle Sierens, co-anchor of the evening news for WFLA, came on board as the Emcee, a tradition that would last for the next 15 years, and gave the event local television coverage.

From 1992 through 2001, Girl Scouts recognized close to 250 women. As the event became increasingly popular locally in 2002, the Women of Distinction reception became an annual signature fundraising luncheon. Additionally, the number of women recognized for the award each year was limited to four to increase the prestige of the recognition.

A key component in making this move a success was introducing a keynote speaker. The first woman in space, Sally Ride, was our first keynote speaker.

She started a long tradition of esteemed speakers, including Jenna Bush Hager, Leeza Gibbons, Jane Goodall, Soledad O'Brien, Alma Powell, Mary Lou Retton, Jehan Sadat, Jane Seymour, and Marlo Thomas, who spoke at the annual awards ceremony.

In 2013, an additional honor was introduced, the Young Woman of Promise, to honor a deserving young woman under 40. In 2016, the Women of Distinction Hall of Fame honor was created to recognize former Women of Distinction recipients who continued their passionate service to the community long after receiving their initial award.

In 2020 and 2021, the event was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Girl Scouts pivoted to host a virtual series of Trefoil Talks with past Women of Distinction and other women leaders to inspire Girl Scouts and early career alumnae. Today, we celebrate 31 years of honoring extraordinary women with this prestigious award.
