

# Communicable Diseases & Healthcare Policies

# The safety of our campers, staff and volunteers is the highest priority for Girl Scouts of West Central Florida.

Based on recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Girl Scouts of the USA (GSUSA) and the American Camping Association (ACA), we made changes and policy decisions during Summer 2022, which may continue through Summer 2023. Our most up-to-date protocols will be listed on our website at <a href="https://www.gswcf.org/summercamp">www.gswcf.org/summercamp</a> and will be updated as more information is released. We are committed to keeping the camp experience as consistent and magical as possible.

In order to keep the entire camp community safe and ensure a positive experience for all campers, we will check for the following during camper check-in:

- Fever of 100.4 degrees or higher
- Symptoms of any contagious condition
- Head lice or evidence of lice in any form
- Any injury or condition that needs immediate medical attention

#### Campers may not remain at camp with fever, signs of a contagious condition, or signs of head lice.

If a camper is sent home at check in due to fever or contagious conditions, they may return with signed letter from their physician stating they do not have any contagious condition and are in good health. In the case of head lice, a campers must wait 24 hours, be free of signs of lice or nits, and are rechecked upon return.

Arrangements to attend a later session may also be made with GSWCF in summer 2023 if space is available. Final decision is at the discretion of the camp director.





#### Heads Up, Heels Down

Cadettes: Week 1

#### Giddy Up

Juniors: Weeks 1, 4

Learn how to groom and saddle a horse. By the end of the week you could be riding and steering all by yourself! You will even get to participate in fun activities like a trail ride or arena games.

#### Ropes & Reins

Brownies & Juniors: Weeks 2, 6

Western Riding: Campers will learn the basics of horseback riding and the best way to groom their horse. They will also participate in games with the horses, daily riding and barn lessons!

#### **Beginner Equine Science**

Brownies & Juniors: Weeks 3, 5

Interested in a career with horses? This week is for you! When you're not riding, you'll hear from a variety of guest speakers in the equine science field. A veterinarian and a blacksmith are just two of the people you'll have the chance to meet and ask all of your questions.

#### Horsewomanship

Brownies & Juniors: Week 7

A spinoff of our Equine Science week where you can learn more about how to properly care for your own horse, in and out of the barn. You'll also learn how your horse communicates with you and other horses.



### Intermediate Horse Camps

Girls must have attended at least 2 horse camps or have equivalent experience prior to attending an intermediate level horse camp. They should be able to steer their own horse safely while walking, and have begun to learn to steer their own horse while trotting.

#### **Happy Trails**

Juniors & Cadettes: Weeks 2, 5

Learn about horse and trail safety, and ride your horse on the shady trails of Camp Wildwood. You'll groom, saddle and steer your own horse!

#### **Camp Cowgirl**

Juniors & Cadettes: Week 3

Western Riding: Learn to care for and ride your horse like a cowgirl! You'll learn about roping and how to work with your horse as a team to complete a fun cowgirl roundup course!

#### **English Saddlers**

Juniors & Cadettes: Week 7



# Counselors-In-Training & Rangers-In-Training

#### Counselor-In-Training I & II

#### (Ages 14-17)

Calling all future camp counselors! If you are ready to unlock your leadership potential and inspire your love of the outdoors to our young campers, you can start working towards your Counselor-In-Training (CIT) Awards. In our CIT program, you will gain the tools you need to become a mentor to younger campers. This training is aligned with the CIT Awards, which Girl Scouts can earn and display on their uniform.

CIT I\*: In CIT I, you'll gain practical experience facilitating camp programs, learning how the summer camp operates, and be the fun camp guide to our youngest campers. The Counselor-In-Training (CIT) program is for campers ready for leadership and responsibility at camp. This is a two-week program, but you get to go home over the weekend!

### Registration & Policies

#### **Registration Deadlines**

To attend summer camp, registration must be received at least TWO weeks prior to the start of the requested camp program and paid in full. However, please be mindful that many popular camp weeks develop waiting lists early in the year. Our programs are first-come, first-served.

If you plan to take advantage of a discount, you must register by the discount deadlines (see Below). This is a high-volume time, and we cannot guarantee assistance in time for the deadline on these dates.

#### **Payment Deadline**

Payments can be made on camp balances in any amount, at any time, up until the deadline. All camps balances must be paid in full by May 15, 2023. Failure to pay in full will result in deposit and space forfeited. All registrations after these dates will require payment in full upon registration.

#### **Discounts**

We are pleased to offer Military Discounts of \$100 off any one session. The Military Discount is offered to campers who have a parent/guardian serving active duty in the United States military. To use this discount, please contact <a href="mailto:info@gswcf.org">info@gswcf.org</a> prior to registration. You must submit proof of duty status (usually military orders). Do not send a copy of a military ID.

#### **Deposits**

A non-refundable deposit is required for each camp session. The deposit for day camp is \$25 per session. The deposit for overnight camp is \$50 per session. The deposit for travel camp is \$100 per travel session.



#### **Financial Assistance**

"Camperships" are available on a needed basis for registered Girl Scouts of West Central Florida whose financial circumstances might otherwise prevent them from attending camp. In order to apply for assistance, you must register and pay a deposit to hold your camper's spot in a session. Then, apply for camperships online at <a href="mailto:swcf.org/SummerCamp">swcf.org/SummerCamp</a>. Deposits will be refunded if scholarship amount is not sufficient to meet your needs. Financial assistant applications will be reviewed starting February 15, 2023. If your family is unable to pay the initial deposit, please contact us at <a href="mailto:info@gswcf.org">info@gswcf.org</a> to discuss alternative options.

#### **Cancellations & Refunds**

Requests for session transfers (space permission) and cancellations must be made via email to <a href="mailto:info@gswcf">info@gswcf</a>.
<a href="mailto:org">org</a> three weeks prior to the session in order to be completed and/or receive a refund, less the deposit. No refunds will be offered within two weeks prior to the start of the session unless: canceled by Girl Scouts of West Central Florida, the camper is required to attend summer school (notice from school required), or due to illness (physician's note is required). We do not offer refunds for no-shows or campers leaving camp early due to behavior, homesickness or health issues. Refunds are not offered for campers arriving at camp with head lice.

Refunds due to cancellation of sessions by Girl Scouts of West Central Florida due to communicable diseases will be provided as follows: if camp session is cancelled before Tuesday at midnight, a full refund will be provided. If camp session is cancelled Wednesday or later, a 50% refund will be provided. This policy only applies in instances where communicable disease outbreaks require GSWCF to cancel sessions or send campers home.

# Trading Posts Gift Certificates\*

The Trading Post offers girls the opportunity to make decisions about what they want to purchase using a gift certificate you have put on their account. Items available at the Trading Post include snacks and drinks, camp memorabilia like t-shirts, stuffed animals, water bottles, journals, flashlights, bandanas, autograph items, fun patches, games and much more.

Prices vary from \$1-\$30 so there is something for everyone. Purchase your Trading Post Gift Certificate online during the registration process or while checking-in at camp. We also accept credit cards, cookie dough and nut bucks at the trading post. Camper rules prohibit cash in the sleeping units so please do not send cash, as we will not have any change on hand.

Most families leave deposits of \$30 for their camper. If a camper does not spend the entire amount, she will receive change in the form of a gift certificate that she can spend at any Girl Scouts of West Central Florida Trading Post or Girl Scouts of West Central Florida Girl Scout Store location.

#### Please note:

We do not except cash at the Trading Post.

\*Gift Certificates are only valid for use at Girl Scouts of West Central Florida Shops or Trading Posts. They are not valid for online purchase at the Girl Scout Shop ecommerce. Girl Scouts of West Central Florida Trading Post Gift certificates do not expire.
