Each day, over 10 million gallons of treated wastewater from the City of Lakeland enters at the influent located at Wetland 1. The water then flows downhill a total of 80 ft. from Wetland 1 to Wetland 7 via distribution ditches. Traveling through the different wetland cells, 90% of nitrogen is able to be removed, meeting Advances Wastewater Treatment (AWT) standards. This process goes slowly taking approximately 100 days. This allows suspended sediment to sink to the bottom where bacteria and microorganisms breakdown pollutants as they become buried in the soil. Once clean, the water exits at Wetland 7 one of two ways: the water can exit through the effluent where it flows to the Alafia River and ultimately into the Tampa Bay, or it can be pumped by the Tampa Electric Company to be used at the Polk Power Station.



Coloring Page: North American River Otter (Lontra canadensis)


The North American River Otter is a semi-aquatic mammal that lives along the North American waterways and coasts. Fully grown, adults can weigh between 11-31 pounds. These predators use their long thick whiskers to detect prey in dark waters as they aid in enhancing their senses. Their diet consists primarily of fish, however, they will also consume amphibians, snails, and turtles to name a few. With a watchful eye, you may be able to spot these playful creatures at Se7en Wetlands.






