Get started! Visit Donate Life America's website DonateLife.net, and complete your choice of the following activities:

1. Learn at least five facts about organ donation and share them with your troop!
2. Find out how many people are currently waiting for a transplant.
3. Make a TikTok promoting organ donation. Use facts/statistics to help promote. Visit the website (www.DonateLife.net) to get some ideas.
4. Look up each organ available for transplant and write down what they do. (lungs, heart, liver and kidneys are a great place to start)
5. Encourage 10 family members or friends to register or discuss their decision to become an organ, eye and tissue donor at registerme.org
6. Imagine that you or a loved one needs a transplant. Think about the different emotions you would feel and talk about them with your troop members or other friends.
7. Make a social media post, promoting organ, eye and tissue donation.
8. Research three common myths about organ donation. Write them down, and then share why these myths are untrue with your troop or family members.
9. Learn the real-life story of a transplant recipient. Pick a story from <https://www.lifelinkfoundation.org/stories/> to share at your troop meeting.
10. Organize a local event to promote organ, eye and tissue donation. Find your Donate Life State Team contact under How You Can Help, Get Involved Locally.
11. Invite an organ recovery professional or recipient/donor family to provide an educational presentation either in person or virtually at your troop meeting, reach out to LifeLink's Public Affairs Coordinator contact under How You Can Help, Get Involved Locally.
